LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

The best way to learn about life as a veterinary technician is to experience it firsthand. Students at the Vet Tech Institute have access to an on-site kennel for training with companion animals. Large animal practicums are conducted at off-site locations so that students also experience training with large animals.

In addition to the full kennel, the Vet Tech Institute's facilities include clinical pathology labs, radiological labs, prep rooms, and surgery rooms, so students can practice what they have learned in lecture classes. From preparing a dog for surgery to conducting a routine exam on a rabbit, Vet Tech Institute students learn by doing.

ANIMAL HUSBANDRY
